Faith: Religion: Church
The Three Pillars of Following Christ

Recently you may have heard me share this triptych in a conversation or sermon about the means of connection with Jesus and His Way. It is possible that our conversation gave you the impression that I have a ranking system for them, and you may be right. However, if we are honest, we all do. And it is likely not exactly the same person to person. And that is OK. What is important, imho, is that we don't throw out the Baby Jesus with the bathwater; we need to maintain the three even as we prioritize them differently. In this article, I will clarify what I mean by these three terms, why I see them as pillars of following the Way, and how Admiral Church helps folx deepen their engagement with each.

I will start with the easiest one to toss (at least for me): RELIGION. The literal definition both is and is not helpful. "Religion is a range of social-cultural systems, including designated behaviors and practices, morals, beliefs, worldviews, texts, sanctified places, prophecies, ethics, and/or organizations, that generally relate humanity to supernatural, transcendental, and spiritual elements—although there is no scholarly consensus over what precisely constitutes a religion." I find religion easy to toss because it is often defined by its durability, which tends towards self-preservation, sometimes at the expense of the people who practice it. However, it is precisely this durability that gives it enduring value for our walk with Jesus. Followers of Christ have collected stories, experimented with practices, had encounters with Spirit, and developed systems of thought and behavior which have oriented them towards the power of Christ at work in their lives. Admiral Church is part of the stream of the Protestant Reformation, a movement grounded in the powerful insight that each individual has access to God personally. We utilize liturgy, ritual, music, and spiritual practices from the broad swath of Protestant (and occasionally Catholic) religious communities in order to draw from the well they have established.


Flowing from Religion (perhaps) comes the second pillar: FAITH. Faith is about the experience of connection and trust in the unseen, ultimately unknowable mystery of the divine. Much of the content of our Faith may be shaped by our Religion, but Faith is the personal experience and internal orientation towards the divine which exists separate from our Religion. This is the component that is developed through introspection, encounters with Creation, experiences of suffering, healing, beauty, and so much more. I tend to use the word "trust" to define Faith, because what we trust in, what we invest in as true regardless of the evidence to the contrary, is what guides us in our struggles and setbacks. Our

Religion may give us practices, but our Faith gives them meaning. Admiral Church is committed to engaging people in developing their Faith through worship, study, pastoral care and counseling, and fellowship.

The third pillar is the one that many people of faith today have let go of: CHURCH. If you are reading this, that probably isn't you. Church is not worship; Church is faith *community*. Most followers of Jesus utilize Religion and Faith, but many in the 21st Century are not finding Church nearly as important. This should not surprise us, as the means of building community have changed drastically in the past 50 years. There are so many more options for connection, service, entertainment, and rest available to people today than ever before, many with little expectation of enduring commitment (though with increasing requirement for payment). Church is a space for commitment, because Church is a place where people grow in their Faith and Religion together; it is a setting where we test out what our Faith means and what our Religion offers in the context of diversity, disagreement, and solidarity. Without a commitment, Church becomes simply a vehicle for Religious education or Faith expression rather than a community of support, challenge, and collective power. Admiral Church welcomes members who take on the shared responsibility of shaping programs and practices for collective growth. We become Church when being together becomes an essential part of our walk with Jesus into His Kin(g)dom.

So, what do you think? Which one matters most to you? If they were in a flow chart, which would come first in your life? If you disagree with my descriptions, let me know! The first three people to respond via email will get a drink on me at their favorite Admiral neighborhood beverage station.


